From the Desk of the Apostle by Apostle Michael L. Collins

Beloved Church Family,

As we step into March, we enter what often feels like a threshold month. In many places, the earth begins to stir. Days grow longer, signs of new life appear, and what once seemed dormant begins to awaken. Spiritually, March reminds us that God is always at work beneath the surface. Even when we cannot yet see the fruit, the Lord is preparing growth, renewal, and fresh obedience in His people.

March is the third month of the year, and throughout Scripture, the number three often reflects divine fullness and testimony. We see this pattern repeatedly: the progression of the Outer Court, the Holy Place, and the Most Holy Place; Yeshua's resurrection on the third day; and the witness that what God promises, He faithfully brings to completion.

For God's holy people, those set apart by His grace, this month invites us to reflect on what it means to walk in spiritual maturity. Holiness is not something we produce through our own effort; it is the result of belonging to the Lord and allowing Him to shape our lives day by day.

March is a good time to ask ourselves important questions: *Where is God calling me to deeper surrender? What habits, attitudes, or distractions need to be pruned so that new growth can flourish?* Just as a gardener carefully tends a field, the Lord lovingly tends His people, correcting, strengthening, and cultivating Christlike character within us.

Let March 2026 be a month of steady and faithful steps. Not rushed. Not anxious. *Simply faithful.* If you find yourself in a season of waiting, remember that God's delays are never His denials. He will revive hope, restore joy, and renew purpose in ways we may not yet see. And if you are experiencing fresh momentum, give Him the glory and keep your heart anchored in prayer. The same God who begins a good work in us is faithful to bring it to completion (Philippians 1:6).

As a congregation, let us move through this month *united* in spirit, *worshiping* wholeheartedly, *serving* generously, and *encouraging* one another sincerely. We are God's holy people, not because we are strong, but because He is holy, and He has called us His own. May the Lord make March a month of spiritual awakening, deeper devotion, and visible fruit in our homes, within His Ekklesia, and throughout our community.

The Leaders Point The Place of the Self-Check by Elder Huger

In every season of growth, there comes a moment when we must pause and take an honest look within. It is easy to recognize challenges around us, such as circumstances, people, or situations, but spiritual maturity calls us to examine ourselves first. *This is the place of the self-check.*

Often, the greatest barriers to a deeper relationship with the Father and with our brothers and sisters in the Ekklesia are not external; they are internal. Unresolved hurt, pride, fear, unforgiveness, and even deep-rooted religious mindsets can quietly build walls in our hearts. When traditions, assumptions, or long-held beliefs go unexamined, they can hinder our ability to receive fresh understanding and walk fully in the truth the Father is revealing. Over time, these things can restrict the flow of love, unity, and growth among the people of God.

The invitation from the Father is not condemnation, but alignment. When we take time in prayer and honest reflection, the Spirit graciously reveals what may be out of order within us. In that sacred space, we can lay those things before Him and exchange them for His wisdom, revelation, healing, and transformation.

A healthy body requires healthy members. When each of us humbly commits to this process of self-examination, we strengthen not only our personal walk with the Father but also the unity of the Ekklesia.

Take a moment this day, week, or month to pause, reflect, and do a self-check.

Lady's Corner A Call to Worship by Lady Collins

For the month of March 2026, let us focus intentionally on worship. Our posture this season should be: **"I Come to Pour."**

In Matthew 26:6-13, the spiritual essence of worship is beautifully revealed. A woman approaches Jesus with "an alabaster box of very precious ointment" and pours it on His head. While some criticized the act as a waste of resources, this moment revealed a profound truth: She did not pour the ointment because of what Jesus had done for her, but because of who He is. True worship is not merely a response to blessings; it is a response to His identity.

Worship Beyond the Song

Worship must be more than music or ritual. It is a whole-person response of heart, soul, mind, and strength offered in reverence to God. It is a posture centered on glorifying Him, grounded in biblical truth, and empowered by the Holy Spirit. This passage also reminds us that worship carries a cost. The perfume was worth nearly a year's wages. What the world condemned as "waste," Jesus called beautiful. For those in a covenant relationship with God, worship is never wasteful; it is a sacred meeting between the Creator and His creation.

The Value of Your Offering

To worship in spirit and truth requires an understanding of the cost. Your "ointment" is found in your journey:

- The pain you endured while remaining standing.
- The loss you experienced while still lifting your voice in praise.
- The sickness you faced while holding onto the promise of healing.
- The fire you walked through, emerging without the smell of smoke.

The Ultimate Surrender

True worship is the surrender of self and the relinquishing of personal idols to offer our entire lives to God. It is not measured by money, but by the willingness to choose spiritual growth over worldly pursuits. It requires sacrificing pride, comfort, and our own plans to draw nearer to Him.

In this season, let us take on this posture. Come not merely to receive. Come not merely to observe. **COME TO POUR!!!**

- 3. Discern Your Environments:** Know what you are stepping into before you enter. Even in dark valleys, you do not have to fear evil, for His rod and staff provide constant comfort and protection. Scripture: Psalm 23:4
- 4. Take Your Time and Trust the Timing:** Do not rush or worry about tomorrow. Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all your needs will be met. Replace anxiety with prayer, and let His peace guard your heart. Key Scriptures: Philippians 4:6-7, Matthew 6:31-34
