Truth and Accountability by Elder Falando Culp

Truth can sometimes be difficult to accept, especially when it requires us to examine ourselves. Yet, as followers of Jesus, we are called to live according to God's truth rather than our own perceptions or preferences.

In John 8:31-32, Jesus said to those who believed in Him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free." To abide in His Word means more than simply reading it. It means allowing His Word to shape our thoughts, decisions, character, and daily actions. Only then can we fully know and walk in the freedom that His truth provides.

God's Word serves as the standard for every area of our lives: our relationships, finances, employment, ministry, and personal conduct. When our lives are aligned with His Word, we are walking in truth. When they are not, we are living outside the very principles God has established for our growth and freedom.

Truth and accountability go hand in hand. As one body, we are accountable not only to God but also to one another. In Galatians 4:16, Paul asks, "Have I therefore become your enemy because I tell you the truth?" Lady's Corner

The Centrality of Prayer in the Life of the Believer by Lady Martha Collins

As we enter the month of June, our attention must remain fixed on the transformative power of prayer. In a world marked by war, poverty, suffering, injustice, and increasing social fragmentation, the Body of Christ possesses a unique and sacred privilege: direct access to the Father through prayer. A foundational biblical text emphasizing the significance of prayer is found in 2 Chronicles 7:14, where God declares:

This passage highlights several essential dimensions of effective prayer: humility, repentance, earnest seeking of God's presence, and spiritual transformation. The promise attached to these actions is profound. God hears, forgives, and brings healing.

Through prayer, believers align their hearts with God's purposes and become increasingly responsive to His will.
