Tiny Truth

When we don't know the **answer**, we can ask God to show us. He's never too busy to listen!

Pack for a Trip!

If YOU were traveling on a camel for days, what would you pack?

Draw 3 things in your "desert suitcase"!

💧 The Waiting Well



The servant finally arrived at a well outside the city of Nahor.

It was hot. He was **thirsty**. His camels were *thirstier*! (Did you know? ONE camel can drink **30 gallons** of water!) He had **TEN** camels.

That's like **300** big jugs!

The servant whispered one more prayer:

🐫 SERVANT PRAYS:

"God, let the right girl say YES. Not just one drink for me – but water for ALL ten camels! That would be LOVE in action!"

Then he **waited**. And watched. And hoped.

🥛 How Much Is a Camel Drink?

Fill a measuring jug or big cup. Count how many times you'd have to pour to reach 30 gallons!

Now multiply by TEN camels. Rebekah was a **super-hero** of kindness!

🌟 Rebekah's Big YES!



Just then, a beautiful girl named **Rebekah** walked up!

She didn't just give the servant **one** drink.

She didn't just offer **half** a jug.

She said something *amazing*:

💖 REBEKAH SAYS:

"Drink, and I will water your camels too!"

And then... she **RAN**! 🏃

Until **ALL TEN CAMELS** were drinking happily!

The servant's mouth hung open. His heart **leaped**.

🌟 God had answered his prayer! 🌟

💡 Tiny Truth

Kindness to **strangers** is love in action! Rebekah didn't know who the man was, but her heart said "YES" anyway.

🏃 Run Like Rebekah!

Tired? Now imagine doing it **30+ times** for thirsty camels!

"Whose family are you?" he asked.

Rebekah smiled. "I'm from Nahor's family — Abraham's **brother!**"

"Rebekah was the daughter of Bethuel... the son of Milcah, the wife of Nahor." — Genesis 24:24

💖 **REBEKAH SAYS:**

"I will go."

No delay. No drama. Just **brave faith**.

Water-Race Kindness Game

1. Set up two plastic cups or bowls on opposite sides of a room or table.
2. Use a small cup to carry water from one bowl to the other.
3. See how FAST you can fill the second bowl! (That's what Rebekah did for ten camels!)
4. Try again — but this time, do it with a **smile**! Rebekah was **happy** to help!
5. Talk about: Are some jobs more fun when we do them with JOY?

Kindness Bracelets

1. Cut strips of colored paper or use pipe cleaners.
2. Write one kind act on each strip: "Help Mom," "Share a toy," "Smile at a stranger."
3. Link them to make a bracelet.
4. Give one to a friend who needs encouragement!
5. Write: **"God sees your kind heart!"** on a gift tag.

Memory Verse Song (Tune: "Here Comes the Bride"):

Watered camels all day through!
God saw her heart, He answered prayer,
Isaac found his treasure there!"*

Family Discussion Time

1. Why did Abraham send his servant far away instead of letting Isaac marry a girl from nearby?
2. What was the servant's prayer sign? What prayer sign could you ask God for today?
3. Rebekah watered TEN camels — that's a LOT of work! What was so special about her kindness to a stranger?
4. Rebekah only said "I will go." Have you ever had to leave something good behind for something better? How did you feel?
5. How did God prepare BOTH the servant's prayer AND Rebekah's heart at the same time? What does that teach us?
6. The Bible calls Jesus our "Bridegroom" and the Church His "Bride" (Revelation 19:7). How does Rebekah's story help us understand how Jesus loves His people?
