We certify that the above fragrance mixture is in compliance with the Standards of the INTERNATIONAL FRAGRANCE ASSOCIATION (IFRA), 51st Amendment to the IFRA Code of Practice or independent supplier evaluation based on the RIFM (Research Institute for Fragrance Materials) Criteria Document and QRA2 (Quantitative Risk Assessment version 2), provided it is used in the following class(es). The maximum usage levels by product category are as follows:

11A	Products with intended skin contact but minimal transfer of fragrance to skin from inert substrate without UV exposure	8.66%
11B	Products with intended skin contact but minimal transfer of fragrance to skin from inert substrate with potential UV exposure	8.66%
12	Products not intended for direct skin contact, minimal or insignificant transfer to skin	100%

For all other applications, or use at higher concentration levels, a new evaluation will be required.
