What We Need From You

Sabre and Jon, these questions are designed for short educational videos that answer the concerns Oklahoma accident victims search for before choosing a lawyer or dealing further with an insurance company. Either attorney may answer any question. If you both answer the same topic, take different angles so the final videos do not repeat one another.

Experience To Draw From

- Sabre can draw from her Oklahoma personal-injury practice, insurance-dispute work, and experience in state and federal courts.
- Jon can draw from his earlier work as an insurance claims representative and his experience with personal-injury claims, disputes, and mediations.
- Both attorneys can explain what accident victims should verify, what decisions deserve caution, and when a consultation may help.

Simple Answer Format

Start	Answer the question in one clear sentence.
Explain	Give two or three points the viewer can understand.
Guide	Tell the viewer what to check or do next.
Invite	Close with a consultation or sharing call to action.

Target length About 60 to 90 seconds per answer. A shorter answer is fine when the point is complete.

Choosing a Law Firm in Oklahoma

These questions expand the local-firm message without repeating the earlier video.

1

How can I verify that a law firm advertising to me is actually established in Oklahoma?

Keep the answer focused on Practical checks such as the firm's physical office, the lawyers licensed here, and the identity of the person who will handle the case.

What should I ask before hiring an accident lawyer I found through Google, television, or social media?

Keep the answer focused on Who the attorney is, who controls the case, how communication works, and what the written agreement says.

What are the pros and cons of hiring a national law firm instead of an Oklahoma firm?

Keep the answer focused on A fair comparison of resources, accessibility, local accountability, and who will actually perform the legal work.

4

Is the lawyer shown in the advertisement the lawyer who will represent me?

Keep the answer focused on Why a prospective client should ask for the assigned attorney's name and understand each person's role before signing.

5

What should I know before agreeing to have my injury case referred or transferred to another law firm?

Keep the answer focused on The lawyers involved, who communicates with the client, who makes decisions, and how the arrangement is explained in writing.

Insurance Claim Questions

These questions address decisions accident victims often face before they know the full value or impact of a claim.

6

The insurance company already accepted fault. Do I still need to speak with an attorney?

Keep the answer focused on Why accepting fault does not automatically resolve medical damages, coverage limits, future needs, or the value of the claim.

7

Should I give the insurance adjuster a recorded statement after an Oklahoma accident?

Keep the answer focused on Who is requesting it, which insurance company is involved, what the policy may require, and why the person should understand the purpose first.

8

Should I sign the insurance company's medical-record authorization form?

Keep the answer focused on The scope of the authorization, the records being requested, and why broad access deserves careful review.

9

Who pays my medical bills while my personal-injury claim is still pending?

Keep the answer focused on The possible sources of payment and why responsibility for the accident does not always mean bills are paid immediately.

10

What happens if the driver who hit me has no insurance or not enough insurance?

Keep the answer focused on Other coverage that may need to be investigated and why the available policies should be reviewed before assuming there is no recovery option.

Optional Questions

Use these only if time allows.

11

How is the value of an Oklahoma personal-injury claim actually determined?

Keep the answer focused on The evidence, medical impact, lost income, insurance coverage, disputed facts, and other case-specific factors without promising a result.

What warning signs may suggest that a nursing-home injury involves neglect rather than an unavoidable medical decline?

Keep the answer focused on Changes families should document, questions they should ask, and why records and individual circumstances matter.

13

What should a family do first if they believe a loved one's death was caused by someone else's negligence?

Keep the answer focused on Preserving information, identifying the proper family representative, and getting case-specific advice promptly.

Attorney Added Topic

If time remains, add one question that clients repeatedly ask but is not listed here. Keep it specific enough that the video can answer one concern clearly.

Closing Options
