Entity Dossier: The People, PACs, and Donors Around the Buildout

STANDING RULE: A contribution establishes access, alignment, and a relationship worth scrutiny. It does NOT establish a bribe, personal enrichment, or a purchased vote without a transaction bridging the money to official action. Two control cases keep this honest: Tinesha Allen and Crystal Vanuch show \$0 contributions in the 2025 snapshots and sat on opposite sides of the fee votes; Darrell English took developer-team money and voted NO on the STACK amendment and the fee giveaway.

1. VIRGINIA YOUTH FUTURES PAC (PAC-25-00014)

Statement of Organization on file with the Virginia Department of Elections, registered at a Stafford address; the affiliated-PAC box is NOT checked — no AIPAC or other affiliation listed. Public snapshot: \$47,689 contributions / \$4,110 expenditures. Where raw filings and aggregate views disagree, THE VIRGINIA FILING CONTROLS.

DONOR / FLOW	AMOUNT	WHO THEY ARE — STAFFORD RELEVANCE
Monica Lynn Gary → VYF	\$12,188.82 (agg. view)	Largest listed contributor; local political figure. CAUTION: her candidate page shows \$6,094.41 paid TO VYF — direction/total mismatch. Do not state either number as final without raw SBE filings.
Jon E. Peterson → VYF	\$5,000	Peterson Companies leadership; Peterson-linked entities are in the Sisson/Simms/Forest/Eskimo cluster and the STACK land history. Also: William E. Peterson, \$5,000 (family/development network).
Charlie Payne → VYF	\$2,000	Hirschler; Stafford data-center land-use counsel (STACK, Amazon, Falmouth Tech); EDA counsel; FRA chair; CTB appointee. The same PAC funds supervisors who vote on his applications.
Stephen DeFalco → VYF	\$1,000	VERIFIED developer principal: Falmouth Tech/Accokeek founder & managing member; Tradition Companies figure. Direct candidate gifts: \$1,000 to English.
Luke Linthicum → VYF	\$1,000	VERIFIED developer manager: Falmouth Tech/Accokeek development manager; Tradition Companies. Direct candidate gifts: \$1,000 to Kecia Evans (the STACK-district supervisor); \$1,000 to English.
Isaac Pretter → VYF	\$5,000	Same-donor AIPAC-lane overlap: he ALSO made federal contributions earmarked through AIPAC PAC (\$1,250 in 2024, \$1,500 in 2025 per FEC records). Overlap only — VYF has no AIPAC affiliation.
VYF → candidates	\$3,100 to Evans (cum. view)	Kecia Evans represents Falmouth — where STACK sits and Accokeek is pending — and joined both Sept 1 fee votes on the YES side. Relationship documented; quid pro quo NOT.

2. THE SILVER NETWORK

LAYER	DOCUMENTED FACT
Corporate spine	Silver Capital LLC is a division of Silver Companies, led by Larry D. Silver (McCann Realty historical release). Silver Capital Advisors manages a family of entities.
English campaign	\$5,000 from Waterford at the Park DE LLC — Florida corporate registry places that exact company under Silver Capital Advisors management. A separate \$5,000 donor labeled Dynasty Funding matches a Silver-managed Florida entity name — raw Virginia transaction still needed. CRITICAL CONTROL: English voted NO on the June 2026 STACK amendment and NO on the September fee actions.

LAYER	DOCUMENTED FACT
Coen campaign	Former supervisor Tom Coen: \$2,500 from Silver Capital LLC (aggregate snapshot). Coen and Payne served together on the FRA board (2022-23 annual report).
Gary campaign	Sileom Ventures LLC, \$5,000 — Florida records identify Silver Capital Advisors as manager. Campaign donation only; no vote purchase shown.
Yeung lead	Carlton Place Leasing contribution on Yeung's campaign record; Florida records place Larry/Spencer Silver as its managers. Underlying Virginia transaction date/address required.
Governance history	Linda Worrell (Silver Companies) chaired the FRA 2017-2020 while Payne was treasurer and a Stafford supervisor and REC's CEO sat on the same board. Board membership is not payment — but it is the documented early overlap.
Direct development	2025: Silver Companies + STACK announced a City of Fredericksburg agreement for 8-12 data centers (potentially \$10B). PROOF Silver is a direct STACK development partner regionally — Fredericksburg, not Stafford asset-specific.

3. THE AGGREGATOR WARNINGS — WHAT CANNOT BE SAID YET

FACT-PAC “Pam Young” \$5,000	A name match to Pamela Yeung is NOT safe identity proof. Do not publish the attribution.	Underlying FACT-PAC (PAC-12-00159) transaction report with donor address/committee ID.
VYF → Evans \$3,100 vs. \$100 views	Different aggregate views reflect periods/transaction types — not evidence of wrongdoing.	VYF receipts/disbursements + Evans Schedule A/B.
Gary direction mismatch	\$12,188.82 in vs. \$6,094.41 out shown on different pages.	Gary committee receipts + VYF disbursement schedules.
All timing claims	Aggregate sites lack transaction dates — no before/after-vote chronology is possible yet.	Raw SBE Schedule A/B/XML for every committee above.

THE STATE-LEVEL LANE (KEPT SEPARATE): VA Digital Infrastructure PAC is funded by STACK, CloudHQ, Vantage, AWS and CyrusOne — organized industry political spending at the state level. No direct Stafford-supervisor payment is shown. The Amit/SIB/ERN/Menora ownership lineage and the Carbyne/Hanaco investment chain are documented in the capital dossier; neither reaches a Stafford political payment.
